The 86th Annual Wisconsin State Gymanfa Ganu (Welsh hymn sing) will be held on Sunday, May 6, 2018, at 2:30 p.m. at First Congregational Church, Plymouth, Wisconsin. Phone: 920-893-3411.

This year we are pleased to welcome Dulais Rhys as our conductor for the 2018. Dulais Rhys conducted our State Gymanfa Ganu in 2007 and we are delighted that he has returned to lead our singing. Dulais is a native of Wales, having grown up in Carmarthen. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Wales with his dissertation on the life and music of Joseph Parry. He also studied at the Peabody Conservatory of Music, Baltimore, Maryland. His teaching appointments include Trinity College of Music in London, and Swansea University. Up until a recent move to Montona, Dulais was on the faculty of the Amabile School of Music and Northern California Music & Arts Culture Center in San Francisco, California. He is a composer, arranger, conductor (choral/orchestral), music competition adjudicator, journalist, media contributor, and public lecturer on various music related topics. Welcome back, Dulais!

2018 Eisteddfod

We welcome your entries for this year's Eisteddfod! The theme for this year is "Hiraeth" or "Longing." You may submit entries in the visual, literary arts, or musical categories. Visual arts include painting, photography, ceramics, textiles, sculpture, etc. The literary arts category includes poems or essays. (See General Rules below for details.) The musical category includes instrumental and/or vocal. Entries are judged on the following criteria: how well the entry captures the Eisteddfod theme; the extent to which it incorporates Celtic components; and the quality of the work.

The literary arts winner receives the "Bard Chair," the visual arts winner receives the "Crown," and the musical category winner receives the "Baton." The Eisteddfod Committee realizes that significant thought, effort, and time go into the creation of literary and visual arts submissions. For that reason during the Eisteddfod ceremonies, all who submit entries will be recognized and thanked for their efforts.

General Rules for Submissions:

- All submitted work, except musical entries, must be original, created specifically for the Eisteddfod competition.
- Submit your entry using a pseudonym (*ffugenw*) rather than your actual name.

Poems: 50 lines or less and may be submitted in English and/or Welsh.

Essays: 750 words or less and may be submitted in English and/or Welsh.

<u>Visual Arts</u>: Including, but not limited to, paintings; photographs; textile items such as quilts, fiber crafts, knitted pieces, or weavings; ceramics; and sculptures. <u>Include</u> a brief statement about how the piece was created and its connection to the theme.

Literary and visual works will be displayed on Saturday and Sunday at the church. To be awarded the Bard Chair, the Crown and/or the Baton, the winning artist must be present at the Announcement of Winners on Saturday, **May 5**th at 5:00 p.m. at First Congregational Church in Plymouth WI.

Deadline for Submissions. Submit all poem or essay entries to Mary Williams-Norton by email at williamsnorton1858@centurytel.net no later than Midnight **April 19, 2018**. Enter all visual art works, and or musical entries, by 11:00 a.m. on Saturday May 5th to the First Congregational Church in Plymouth, WI.

The Welsh Songfest Tour of Nebraska

The St. David's Welsh Society of Nebraska sponsored a week-long "Welsh Songfest Tour of Nebraska" to celebrate Nebraska's Sesquicentennial, and the continuing contribution of Welsh-Americans to Nebraska culture.

Organized by the Society's president, Lori McAlister, the tour started October 15 with two shows at the Midwest Theater in Scottsbluff and moved eastwards, stopping at "The Most Unlikely Place", (a large café/arts venue in Lewellen), the Widman Cinema in Central City, Westminster Presbyterian Church in Omaha, and ended in Lincoln on October 22 at the annual Gymanfa Ganu at St. Matthew's Episcopal Church.

The 90-minute long presentation combined Welsh folk music and stories performed by the Virginia-based Welsh band, Moch Pryderi, (Mary Triola, Rik Rice, Luke Gray, and Bill Reese), with a Gymanfa Ganu led by song leader Joe Corbin of Reedsburg, Wisconsin. The hymns were integrated into the Welsh folk music presentation and the audience was eager not only to listen but to participate with enthusiasm in the communal singing.

Each show was preceded by a showing of "Pobl y Paith/People of the Prairie: The Welsh in Nebraska." This 20-minute presentation was produced by the Great Plains Welsh Heritage Centre in Wymore, Nebraska.

In addition to stage shows, the tour participated in numerous arts outreach programs, playing in schools and retirement homes along the way. At each stop the band also demonstrated a variety of traditional Welsh musical instruments including the Welsh Triple Harp, Pibgorn, and Pibau Cŵd. Moch Pryderi and Joe Corbin were also the guests of Jose Soto at Southeast Community College in Lincoln. The band gave a lecture and demonstration of Traditional Welsh Folk Instruments and Joe Corbin spoke about the Eisteddfod and his participation in the event.

When asked about the success of the tour, Nebraska Welsh President Lori McAlister commented, "The statewide Welsh Song Fest Tour was an amazing experience. Having worked with the members of Moch Prvderi to celebrate the St. David's Welsh Society Centennial in 2010 and with song leader, Joe Corbin, on our annual Gymanfa Ganu for several years, my expectations were high. Our week on the road knocked them out of the park. Putting it all together, along with our hosts at each stop, was extremely gratifying. It confirmed that the extra effort to take a statewide organization out into the state is well worth it. I met so many new friends with an interest in their Welsh connections. I met one long-time society member for the first time as geography prevents him attending our usual events held in Lincoln. While we can't mount an effort like this every year, I'm hopeful that our new connections will open the way and provide the energy to celebrate Welsh heritage all across Nebraska every year."

Many patrons drove a long way—an hour or more—to participate in these programs. Most audience members were not aware of the richness and widespread nature of Welsh culture in Nebraska. The enthusiasm and warm reception of these audiences, and of the volunteers who hosted these shows, was truly amazing.
