Welsh Folk Dancing 2:15PM You can do it! Or enjoy watching us and encourage us as Danny Proud gives instructions on Welsh Folk Dancing. Danny has been involved with Welsh music in all its aspects. He has sung with Welsh choirs, including the North American Welsh Choir, Welsh folk groups and vocal ensembles, and danced with Traed y Ddraig (Feet of the Dragon). Over the years he has represented the Welsh in festivals and events throughout the Midwest. Most recently, he co-chaired the North American Festival of Wales which was held in Milwaukee in August, 2019.

Baking in Wales 3:00PM Jan Batty has researched this interesting topic and will provide information and demonstrations about how our Welsh ancestors baked. We will have plenty of samples to enjoy with our Te Bach. Jan grew up in a Welsh home and learned the fine art of Welsh teacake baking from her aunt. She has enjoyed her participation over the years in all things Welsh. Most recently, she co-chaired the North American Festival of Wales which was held in Milwaukee in August, 2019.

Welsh History in Wisconsin 4:00PM Don't miss this opportunity to view Robert Humphries' poignant video entitled "We are the Welsh of Wisconsin" and learn about Welsh settlements, as well as how Wisconsin was a crossroad for Welsh emigration further west.

2020 Eisteddfod

We welcome your entries for this year's Eisteddfod! The theme for this year is "Dŵr" or "Water." You may submit entries in the visual, literary arts, or musical categories.

- Visual arts include, but are not limited to, painting, photography, ceramics, textiles and sculpture created for this year's competition. Each entry must include a brief statement about how it was created and how it fits the theme. Visual arts pieces along with their explanations must be turned in during registration on Saturday of the Welsh Weekend.
- The literary arts category includes poems (50 lines or less) or essays (750 words or less). (See General Rules below for details of the submission deadline and submission procedures.)
- The musical performance category may include voice and/or instrumental, performance chosen to relate to the theme.

All Eisteddfod entries are judged on the following criteria: how well the entry captures the Eisteddfod theme; the extent to which it incorporates Welsh components; and the quality of the work.

The literary arts winner receives the "Bardic Chair," the visual arts winner receives the "Crown," and the musical category winner receives the "Baton."

The Eisteddfod Committee realizes that significant thought, effort, and time go into the creation of literary, visual arts and musical submissions. For that reason, during the Eisteddfod ceremonies all who submit entries will be recognized and thanked for their efforts. Those who submit entries or compete must be present during the Eisteddfod prize ceremony to receive a prize.

General Rules for Submissions:

All submitted work, except musical entries, must be original, created specifically for the Eisteddfod competition. Submit your entry using a pseudonym (*ffugenw*) rather than your actual name.

Voice and instrumental soloists are encouraged to use Welsh music. Welsh hymns must be selected from the WGGAW or WNAA hymn books.

Poems: 50 lines or less and may be submitted in English and/or Welsh.

Essays: 750 words or less and may be submitted in English and/or Welsh.

Visual Arts: Including, but not limited to, paintings; photographs; textile items such as quilts, fiber crafts, knitted pieces, or weavings; ceramics; and sculptures. Include a brief statement about how the piece was created and its connection to the theme.

Literary and visual works will be displayed on Saturday and Sunday at the church. To be awarded the Bardic Chair, the Crown and/or the Baton, the winning artist must be present to attend the Announcement of Winners on Saturday, **May 2nd** at the church.

Deadlines for Submissions. Submit all poem and essay entries and copies of music for the accompanists and adjudicators to Mary Williams-Norton by email at williamsnorton1858@centurytel.net no later than midnight **April 4, 2020**. Email music as attached PDF files, or call/email Mary for her street address if you prefer to use the US Postal Service.

Enter all visual art works between 2:00 and 3:00 p.m. (registration period) on Saturday May 2nd at The Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in Fond du Lac, WI.

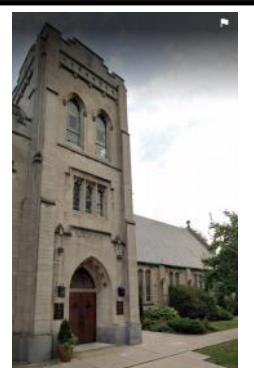
