
Tour of the LaClare Family Creamery There is a \$5.00 charge for the tour. Note: Part of the tour has a stairway to climb.

2021 Christmas Gymanfa Ganu

With a few snowflakes flying in the air, Wisconsinites welcomed the Christmas season with the annual Christmas Gymanfa Ganu on Sunday, November 14, 2021. This year our event was hosted by Jerusalem Presbyterian Church in Wales, Wisconsin. Welcoming remarks and announcements were made by Welsh Gymanfa Ganu Association of Wisconsin (WGGAW) President Bron Wentzel, and church pastor Rev. Andrew E. Holmes provided the devotions.



Rev. Joe Corbin, no stranger to the cymanfaoedd canu scene, was our capable director. He chose four sets of hymns - Advent, The Announcement, The Birth, and Christ Lives in Us - from the WGGAW Christmas hymnal. Most of the selections are old Welsh favorites with Christmas words. Even those new to Welsh got through the language with flying colors, and we sang Stille Nacht in German, English and Welsh. In the

last set of hymns, we sang Tôn Garol, with the English translation by our own board member Danny Proud.

Mary Peterson, the church organist, provided accompaniment for the afternoon, and special music was presented by the church choir under the direction of Nathan Zywicki. They sang "Sanctuary" and "The Magnificat," and most choir members joined the congregation for the remainder of the hymn singing. Afterward, a well-earned te bach awaited us in the fellowship hall. Wisconsin's Welsh Tea Lady Ann Lemmenes brought her teapots, cups and tea cozies and we enjoyed fresh brewed tea, snacks



and many home-baked goodies made by board and church members. After a long absence, we finally had an opportunity to catch up with old friends and get to know those attending for the first time.

A note about our host: Jerusalem Presbyterian Church's congregation has been in existence since 1842 and was founded by Welsh settlers. Its original location was at

Jerusalem Cemetery a little over a mile away. As the Village of Wales grew, a new location was selected. Church members carved out the entire basement by hand, hauled the fill out with a stone boat and a team of horses, and the current building was dedicated in 1913. It remains an active congregation to this day
