Biographies

THE DIRECTOR Rev. Joe Corbin has served for 26 years as pastor at First Presbyterian Church, Reedsburg WI, in addition to being Stated Supply at Peace Presbyterian Church, Mauston WI for the past two years. He studied vocal performance at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, School of Music and earned a BA in Music from the University of Dubuque, IA. He completed his M.Div. at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary.

Joe is a long-time contributor to the Welsh scene in Wisconsin and beyond as a performer, eisteddfod contestant and director of many cymanfaoedd canu. Joe will also direct the Milwaukee Gymanfa Ganu on July 14 in Greenfield (details inside this program).

THE ORGANIST Dennis Jon Wolfgang was named Director of Music and Organist at Nativity Lutheran Church, Wauwatosa on September 1, 2010 and on November 1, 2017 he was named to the same position at Christ Lutheran Church in Jackson, Wisconsin. Once a month he plays the 9:30 a.m. Sunday Service at Our Lord's United Methodist Church in New Berlin. Previously he served as Director of Music/Organist at Milwaukee's historic Basilica of St. Josaphat, as well as numerous other Lutheran and Catholic Churches. In June of 1998 he played the dedicatory concert on the new Radanovich pipe organ in the chapel of "Our Lady of the Sioux" at St. Joseph's School for Indian Children in Chamberlain, South Dakota. He has also played the Miller Concert Organ in Milwaukee's Uihlein Hall for a national convention. The past nine years Dennis was honored to be organist/choir director for the Shamrock Club of Wisconsin's St. Patrick's Mass at Milwaukee's Historic St. Patrick's Church. In addition, he is curator and House Organist of the large pipe organ installed in the Hallamór of the Irish Cultural and Heritage Center, 2122 West Wisconsin Avenue. Dennis loves gardening and life with his cats, Barnabas Patrick and George Frederic.

SPECIAL MUSIC Since moving to Milwaukee in 1985, soprano **Susan Platt** has sung with a number of musical groups including the Bel Canto Choral Artists, the Milwaukee Symphony Chorus, the Milwaukee Symphony Chamber Chorus, and Present Music. Ms. Platt has also appeared as a soloist with organists Karen Beaumont, Gary Wood, Dennis Jon Wolfgang, the Bach Chamber Choir, Plymouth Chorale, Great Lakes Opera, the Notre Dame Recorder Consort and the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra and Chorus, performing in works by composers ranging from Andriessen and Reich to Mozart, Bach and Handel. She is currently appearing with the praise band Leap of Faith at Peace UMC. Other repertoire includes programs of a capella chant in many forms (including Gregorian, Ambrosian, and that by Hildegard von Bingen).
