Immanuel Presbyterian Church

About the congregation:

Traditional and creative worship is the foundation of our life together. Four dynamic and caring ministers provide leadership for our life together in congregation and community. About the building:

Immanuel Presbyterian Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1974 and was designated a landmark by the Milwaukee Landmarks Commission in 1969. It was designed in High Victoria Gothic style



by architect Edward Townsend Mix. Within the last five years, the Tiffany stained glass windows in the sanctuary have undergone restoration.

About the pipe organ:



E. G. & G. Hook and Hastings et al Op. 1045 – 1881, 83 Stops, 73 ranks, approx. 4600 pipes.

The Immanuel Presbyterian Church organ has a rich history. It was built in 1881 for the Milwaukee Exposition Hall by the E.G. & G. Hook Company of Boston. The Immanuel Church organist, Professor Garret, played for the opening of the hall in September of 1881.

The organ was moved by horse and wagon to Immanuel Church and rebuilt on site after a fire in 1887 destroyed the sanctuary and its organ. The Wangerin Organ Company of Milwaukee rebuilt the organ in 1926 and a dedication recital was played by the famed Lynnwood Farnam of Boston.

In 1958 the church was extensively remodeled. The chancel of the current sanctuary was expanded and the organ was moved from the room into a chamber behind a dossal. Whether the organ was renovated or tonally changed at this time is not known. In the 1970's, organist and choir director Frederik Bach initiated another rebuilding by the American Organ Company of Milwaukee.

The organ was re-voiced in 2000-02, returning some of the instrument's historic sound. New pipe work was built specifically for the organ by A.R. Schopp & Sons of Alliance, OH. In 2005 Fabry, Inc. of Antioch, IL built a new console. In 2009 the organ was completely re-leathered. A new façade was built as part of the 175th anniversary celebration, restoring the appearance of the organ to its original design. The "new" chancel was dedicated in December, 2012. Tonal renovation continued in 2018 with the addition of two more ranks and pipe relocation within the chamber.

Biographies



DIRECTOR This year's director is Robert Evans of Bourbonnais, Illinois who is 100% Welsh. He is a graduate of Northwestern University with Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees, and doctoral work completed at the University of Illinois. He has been a music educator, conductor, clarinetist, and adjudicator in Minnesota and Illinois and has taken performance groups to appear in Wales and England. Currently, he teaches on

the music faculty of Olivet Nazarene University where he directs the Concert Band, co-teaches the Clarinet Studio, and teaches Advanced Conducting.



ORGANIST Our organist, Steve Jensen, began playing the piano and organ at the age of nine. He had his first regular church job at the age of thirteen. During grades 9-12 he studied at Lawrence Conservatory of Music in Appleton, Wisconsin. He continued his organ study during college at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

His first Gymanfa Ganu was in 1977 in Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin. The conductor was Lyn Harry of Canada. Mr. Harry requested that Mr. Jensen play the following year at the National Gymanfa Ganu in Minneapolis in 1978. Since then Steve has played for many local, state and national cymanfaoedd.

Mr. Jensen is currently employed as a consultant for Froedtert Health and serves as Organist at Immanuel Presbyterian Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.



SPECIAL MUSIC Gwenith Closs-Colgrove was born and raised on a Welsh family farm south of Wymore, Nebraska which was, at one time, home to many Welsh immigrants coming for land in the late 1800's. Her great-grandfather came to Nebraska in 1878. Gwenith was baptized and attended the Calvinistic Methodist Church locally known as Bethel. In the early days, all services were conducted in

Welsh. Her father, Ellsworth Closs, who passed away in 2000, was the last Welsh speaker from this community.

Music was always a part of the Closs household and Gwenith began studying voice at Kansas University, later Doane College and most recently the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. She has been fortunate to sing in the U.K. and at Carnegie Hall in New York City as a member of many audition choirs.

In 2016, Ms. Colgrove, took over the role of President of the Great Plains Welsh Heritage Project and Archive for Welsh America. Since its inception in late 2000, the museum has grown exponentially with the assistance of many dedicated volunteers. The Archive now houses the only microfilm copies of Y Drych dating back to the 1850's and many one-of-a-kind artifacts that have graciously been donated from many societies and individuals with a Welsh background.

Gwenith is married to Gary Colgrove and they have two sons and six grandchildren. Her goal is to ensure that all future generations are aware of this wonderful Welsh heritage and carry it forward.
