Rev. Joseph G. Corbin, Director. Joe is a retired Presbyterian minister. He now serves as a supply pastor for several churches. He received his formal training at The University of Wisconsin, School of Music, where he studied vocal performance. He earned a B.A. in Music from the University of Dubuque and a Master of Divinity degree from The University of Dubuque Theological Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa.

Joe is well known for directing Cymanfoedd Canu and St. David's Day festivities throughout Wisconsin, Illinois, Nebraska, Ohio, Colorado, Pennsylvania, and Minnesota. He has also helped lead many late-night

informal singing sessions at the North American Festival of Wales (NAFOW) gatherings.

Joe and his wife Kim have two grown children and five grandchildren. Joe and Kim have been active in theater and musical theater, acting and directing. Joe has been active in various vocal performing groups. Winter sports and the out of doors top their favorite activities.



Steve Jensen began playing the piano and organ at the age of nine. He had his first regular church job at the age of thirteen. During grades 9-12 he studied at Lawrence Conservatory of Music in Appleton, Wisconsin. He continued his organ study during college at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

His first Gymanfa Ganu was in 1977 in Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin. The conductor was Lyn Harry of Canada. Mr. Harry requested that Mr. Jensen play the following year at the National Gymanfa Ganu in Minneapolis in

1978. Since then Steve has played for many local, state and national Cymanfaoedd.

Mr. Jensen is currently employed as a financial consultant and serves as Organist at Immanuel Presbyterian Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.



Ann E. Lemmenes studied music at The Welsh College of Music and Drama in Cardiff, Wales, G.B. where she studied voice, piano and took lessons on the Llandaff Cathedral pipe organ. Recently, she accepted the organist position at the Cathedral of St. Paul in Fond du Lac.

While attending Welsh Heritage Week, she took harp lessons, but was self-taught many years prior. Her vocal trio, Ecclesiastes III, recorded

her harp arrangement of "Away in a Manger" on its Christmas album in 1990s. Directing Cymanfoedd Canu since 1992 is always an inspiring venture locally or out of state.

After retiring from her music teaching position, Ann has enjoyed coaching students for Solo & Ensemble at Waupun High School.
