WORKSHOPS, POT-LUCK LUNCHEON, EISTEDDFOD AND PRYNHAWN LLAWEN

The Saturday portion of the **Fourth Welsh Weekend for Everyone** will be held at Jerusalem Presbyterian Church, 207 West Main St., Wales, Wisconsin. Following a theme of *Welsh heritage: Welsh faces and places*, the program will feature morning and afternoon workshops, a potluck luncheon, and conclude with a combined eisteddfod and prynhawn llawen. There will be fun activities to involve people of all ages who have an interest in Wales or things Welsh.

IMAGES OF WALES AND WELSH CONNECTIONS: To support the *Welsh heritage: Welsh faces and places theme*, each person who attends should bring any pictures of favorite Welsh places, Welsh ancestors, and Welsh friends that are special to them. We hope that these pictures will spark lots of conversation and sharing during the day. Any image from an old family portrait to a postcard from a recent trip to Wales would be of interest to all.

WORKSHOPS: Workshops on subjects ranging from sports to genealogy will be offered. During the day participants will be able to try out rugby, or create Welsh-style dessert delights, or learn how to research family history or learn more *Cymraeg* (Welsh language) or learn and practice some of the hymns to be sung during the State Gymanfa Ganu on May 2 or learn and sing Welsh folk songs, and these are only a few of the workshops that will be offered. A full list with descriptions will be available as participants arrive on May 1. There will be one session of workshops before lunch at 10:30 A.M. and two sessions after lunch so that each person can take part in three different learning experiences.

COMMEMORATIVE T-SHIRT PRINTING: Again this year artist Tom Muich will be designing a logo for a silk screen. Anyone interested in having a t-shirt or other item printed as a remembrance of *Pedwerydd Penwythnos Cymreig i Bawb* should plan to bring such in on Saturday, May 1.

POTLUCK LUNCHEON: Another opportunity to share heritage is planned as part of the luncheon. **Each participant is asked to bring** a favorite appetizer, salad, bread, entrée, casserole, or other item **except dessert** to contribute to the pot luck. Desserts will be created by the participants in the morning workshops entitled **Beyond Welsh cakes: Welsh Dessert Delights** and shared at the luncheon to complement that variety of other foods participants share.

EISTEDDFOD and **PRYNHAWN LLAWEN:** The day will conclude with a combined eisteddfod and prynhawn llawen to showcase the literary and musical talents of participants. The call to bards for the Chair competition is this:

Barddoniaeth / Poetry Gwobr / Prize: Cadair yr Eisteddfod / Eisteddfod Chair

A stanza, or series of stanzas of less than 50 lines total, dealing with "heritage". The work should have a Welsh theme or connection. Welsh language submissions are welcomed and encouraged.

The Chair competition is open to anyone. There will also be a competition for <u>children under age 13</u> to create an acrostic poem using the words **Welsh heritage**. Forms to submit the acrostic will be available at registration. All literary entries must be submitted by noon on May 1 and the winner must be present at the eisteddfod to win.

All those who do **musical performance** will be automatically entered in the eisteddfod musical competition. Prizes will be awarded to those performances judged best on the basis of musical ability and connections to Welsh heritage. Judges will set the categories based on the performances offered.

Welsh baritone and conductor, Trefor Williams was born into a musical family in Trefor, Gwynedd in northern Wales. A popular choir and brass band conductor in Wales, in 1998 Trefor put down his roots in Milwaukee, and decided to become a full-time professional musician. He has studied voice with Patricia Nelson and William Duvall, and expanded his musical knowledge through private study. Trefor has held many positions in the Milwaukee area, with churches, schools and Milwaukee Festival Brass. He runs his own voice studio in Milwaukee teaching many accomplished young and adult singers. He has recently established a new mixed performance company of professional and amateur singers – Milwaukee Metropolitan Voices. Trefor has sung and conducted at many Welsh American events from California to Pennsylvania, as well as many other appearances at concerts throughout the Milwaukee area and the state of Wisconsin.



Ann Lemmenes – organist - Ann studied organ at the Llandaff Cathedral in Wales and at UW-Milwaukee. She taught music in the Milwaukee and then Waupun Public Schools for a total of 31 years and just recently retired. She has been the Director of Music at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Waupun for 18 years. Still directing two choirs, playing the pipe organ most Sundays and leading Contemporary worship the last Sunday of the month, Ann doesn't know how she did both jobs and raised a son! With two grandchildren, Meghan and Torin, in spite of being retired, it is hard to find time to visit them in Milwaukee.
